




Harvest – Monday 3rd October

We will be holding our annual Harvest Service on <u>Monday 3rd October</u>. We walk from school to the church after registration. As a result the service will begin at approximately 9:20 – hoping we can walk to school as quickly as possible.

At Harvest and throughout the year we support a school via Mary's Meals in Malawi. The charity enables children to have meals each day which are provided in schools. This means there is a dual impact of providing children with meals and providing them with an education.





We will be asking children to raid their money boxes, talk with family members and discuss the charity to see if we could give generously to provide children with food for a year. Please can children bring money into school as a Harvest gift for those who do not have as much as we do. *Thank you. If you have 6 minutes please look at this video as an example of the work the charity does.* Our target is at least £200. (if everyone was able to give £1). Believe it or not but £12.20 provides a child with a meal each day for a year! We really can make a difference.
