This was all part of our commitment to the South Lakes Pupil Parliament and I'm sure you'll be hearing more about their role over the year as they tackle some of the issues raised from the meeting.

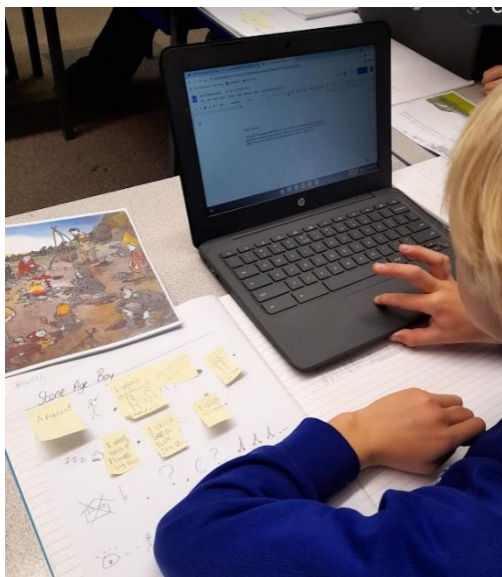
