Parents' meetings

We are very keen to promote good communication and relationships between school and parents as we all know this is the best way to provide the most stable, supportive and encouraging environment for your children. If there are ever any concerns about your child, either socially, emotionally or academically, their class teacher will always get in touch to discuss the ways forward with you personally. And, likewise, we would actively encourage anyone with a concern or problem to get in touch with the class teacher directly so as to avoid any misunderstandings or unnecessary concern.

Another part of keeping in touch is through our Parents' meetings, and the time is fast approaching to discuss how your child has settled in to their class. Partly due to the popularity of our online meetings last year and the ever-changing Covid picture in the local area, we will be holding these on Google Meet and giving you the opportunity to book your own timeslot using an online poll. As with last time, we can only offer one slot per child so we are unable to hold multiple meetings for different parents.

From personal experience of booking on to my own children's meetings, I would encourage you to write down the time and date you have chosen as it is incredibly easy to forget! Once you have selected your time (you can scroll left or right should you need to), you will need to add your full name or child's name at the left of the screen and click on the green "send" button below the dates.
