Let's celebrate this wonderful achievement and continue to champion the importance of art and creativity in education!




## PTA – THANK YOU

# Attendance

Recently, we had an attendance review with Westmorland and Furness. I have agreed to communicate the following information after the meeting:

Following the meeting it is worth noting the following:

- Lateness after the register has closed will be classed as an absence not late and this is being monitored by the Local Authority
- We are required, to refer unauthorised absence at or over 5 days to the Local Authority after the child has returned. The Local Authority will the make a decision about fining.
- If a pupil's attendance is below 10% where a child has been sick but there has also been a holiday contributing also, a referral has to be made for the Local Authority to decide whether a fine is required.

- What type of books are their favourite genre or style of book?

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






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
