Participating in these three apps on a regular basis can be directly linked to your child's progress in maths and being ready for Year 7. Whether exploring The One Minute maths app in Nursery to Year 5, the app provides internet free access to developing your child's mental maths skills. Doodle Maths, responds to your child's needs and supports and motivates them whilst accessing the games and maths learning needed throughout primary school. T T Rockstars is used from Year 3-6 and focuses on timetables, either speeding up your responses or actually learning the times tables up to

Please can you monitor your child's weekly engagement on these and check how well they are doing? Your support will make a really big difference in the consistency of their learning in maths.

Attendance

We have had our half termly attendance review this week, with our Local Authority Officer, reviewing attendance, monitoring our registers and looking to monitor patterns of absence, lateness, with a view to supporting families if necessary. Parents can always check their child's attendance on the Arbor App. Please note that we aim for attendance to be 95% or above and any attendance under 90% is being actively reviewed by the Local Authority and ourselves.
